We are now focusing on our [2011 Hadley Reunion](#). It is tentatively set for Friday and Saturday, **July 15th and 16th 2011** in the Lexington/Concord area of Massachusetts.

We are looking at Friday July 15th as a tour of the Lexington/Concord battle grounds with possible optional side tours of the Louisa May Alcott and Ralph Waldo Emerson homes. Saturday July 16th will be the main reunion, probably taking place in one of the social halls of an area church.

The focus of the reunion will be on **The Hadleys as Pioneers.** We are planning on directing our efforts more on the Hadleys of yesteryear through eyes of an historical background. We expect to start our presentation beginning with our George who arrived about 1628 and ending about the time of the American Revolution in 1775/6. We will be looking at the two male lines from George-- those of Samuel who, for the most part, stayed around the Amesbury/Salem/Rowley area of Massachusetts; and the line of Joseph who went to and lived in the Yonkers area of New York.
