CANADA/USA HADLEY CONNECTION:

As many know, we have a Hadley DNA project underway http://www.hadleydna.org/. A principal goal of this project is to prove our trans-Atlantic connection, which is most likely from the British Isles. It is our hope to find a male Hadley in England who can trace his roots back to the 1500s. If we can find such a person who will participate in our DNA study, we may be able to establish a connection with our George who settled in Massachusetts we think around 1628.

To that end, **Hilton Hadley**, <u>lindahadley@xplornet.com</u>, from Alberta, Canada was previously unknown to most of the US Hadleys who are participating in our DNA study. His results proved he was connected to **Jim Hadley**, <u>Jags@hvc.rr.com</u>, Port Ewen, NY. Jim has proof of his lineage to our patriot, George, (ca 1612-1686.)

We knew Hilton was from Canada although knew nothing else about him. A simple "White Page" phone directory search, found a **Linda and Hilton Hadley** in Alberta, Canada. Lots of research done by **Linda Hadley**, the wife of Hilton facilitated having Jim finding his genealogical connection to Hilton. This yielded about 900 Canadian Hadleys mainly from the Provinces of Ontario, Alberta, Manitoba, and British Columbia. Genealogical work done by **Ardella MacPhee**, ardella@ns.sympatico.ca, of Nova Scotia had previously established about 600 Canadian Hadleys in and around that Province.

Joseph (Headley) Hadley (1724-1801) immigrated to Nova Scotia and William Hadley (ca 1785-ca, 1861) immigrated to Ontario. These two men came from two different locations and time periods within the United States. The DNA results proved these men and their respective off-spring are related to each other as well as to our George.
