

George Hadley Database: c 1612-1686

Many have been studying and continue to do research on their immediate Hadley family. They often upload their findings into a general database and without their invaluable input and willingness to share their research, the **Hadley Website** www.hadleygenealogy.net or www.hadleygenealogy.com would not be possible.

The **Hadley Website** is uploaded from a master database that is developed and held in a private format by **Jim Hadley** Jags@hvc.rr.com. With the exception of releasing the names of living people, all other genealogical data for living people is kept private. There is no cost to you for using that website. The website contains records of those who have gone before us. The **Hadley Website** is there for you, your inspection, and use. There are no pop-ups or advertisements on the website and no record is kept on those who have visited that site. Currently there are records on over 26,100 Hadleys and some of the folks who are directly related to them. In addition, the monthly *Hadley Newsletters* can be found on the **Hadley Website** www.hadleygenealogy.net. For those with a greater need for exploration, the monthly *Hadley Newsletters* are on file with the US Library of Congress and their location can be accessed at: (<http://catalog.loc.gov>) and by entering **Hadley Newsletter** in the search box. For those visiting Washington DC, the *Hadley Newsletter* collection can be found in the Jefferson Building of the US Library of Congress (<http://www.loc.gov/rr/main/>).
