Interesting Death Certificates:

This month we continue with some unusual terminology found on death certificates.

1. John Hadley died in Wilton, NH on 06 Mar 1868 from "consumption." His occupation is listed as a "Pauper."
2. Franklin Hadley died in Lyndeborough, NH on 15 July 1871 from "Kidney Complaints."
3. John Langden Hadley died in South Weare, NH on 17 Jan 1892 from "La Grippe."
4. Obadiah Hadley died in Groton, NH on 22 Mar 1900 from "[Syncope](#)."
5. Philura Hadley died in Manchester, NH on 22 Sept 1863 from "Paralysis."
6. Rachael Morgan Hadley died in Canaan, NH on 03 Oct 1888 from "Old Age."



Hadley Room Updates:

We are now beginning our fund raiser that will see the creation of a *Hadley Room* to be located in and become a part of the Narragansett Historical Society in Templeton, MA. The purpose of the special room will be to house and display historical items, artifacts and records that are part of our Hadley family. This is the first dedicated room for this museum and is unique for a museum to authorize a special room for the collection devoted to one family.

Our family history dates back to the first part of the 17th century in North America. We have unique artifacts that pertain to our Hadley family and these need to be preserved.
