David Monroe Hadley:

David Monroe Hadley (1844 – 1917)

<http://www.hadleygenealogy.net/ghtout/gp756.html> served as a Private, Company G 8th Louisiana Infantry Regiment for the Confederate States of America (CSA). His lineage goes back to our patriarch George. David was born in Cheneyville, Louisiana and was one of about 11 children born to William Peter Gershom Hadley and Lucinda Caroline Howard. David's grandfather was the renowned Rev. Moses Laurence Hadley who was born in Yonkers, NY, moved to the south, and died in Woodville, Mississippi. (We are planning on featuring Rev. Moses in a future Hadley Newsletter). We know there were a number of male Hadleys related directly to Rev. Moses who fought in the Civil War for the Union. It is likely some were in battles where their cousins

were fighting for the Confederacy. We are currently researching some of the Civil War battles for the names of Hadleys from both the North and South in an attempt to identify those battles where related Hadley kin could have unknowingly met in battle. Susanna (Pithouse)Hadley:

John Hadley (1653-1711) <http://www.hadleygenealogy.net/ghtout/gp1037.html> was a son of our patriarch George Hadley (1612-1686). When John died in 1711, his widow Susanna remarried on 19 Nov 1712 to Peter Patee in Gloucester, Essex, Massachusetts. We have **Barbara (Hadley) Edge**, email: barb.edge@yahoo.com to thanks for uncovering this new data. Barbara uncovered the information that Susanna's maiden name was not Patee as most researchers have thought but that it was Pithouse. Patee was the name of her second husband (or a variation on the spelling as Pittis). This information is found in the rather confusing entry from Gloucester, MA and apparently transcribed incorrectly by the publisher of the book "*Peter Patee of Haverhill, Massachusetts: A Journeyman Shoemaker, and his Descendants*".
