

Meet Henry “Harry” Harrison Hadley IV: (1936-2020)

“Henry Harrison Hadley IV was born on July 2, 1936 when his parents lived in the small village of New Berlin, NY. Like his father before him, he has always felt a love of the countryside of upstate New York. When Harry was 2 years old, his family moved to suburban Cincinnati, OH where they lived until 1946 when they moved to Montclair, NJ. It was there that Harry found an old trumpet in the attic of the Rectory and started his interest in playing brass instruments which has continued throughout his life.



In 1950, the family moved to Hamilton, NY where Harry graduated from Hamilton High School. During his high school years, he played in a jazz band founded by his brother, “Hopp” (James Hopkins). He was on the debate team and was a member of the yearbook staff. Following his father and grandfather, he went to Princeton University graduating in the Class of 1958 with a degree in Mechanical Engineering. After graduation he taught mathematics at Hopkins Grammar School in New Haven, CT from 1958 until 1961 while doing graduate work in math at Syracuse University.

He then decided to find work in his field of engineering and went to work for General Laboratories Associates, a small company in Norwich, NY which manufactured ignition systems for jet airplanes. They had received a contract from NASA to work on parts for the Apollo space program and Harry became one of the design engineers for several of those parts. He has always been very proud of his work on the design and production of the component that separated the rocket stages and also allowed the landing module to blast off from the moon on the return.

Harry married Janna Peterson on June 23, 1962 in Greenwich, CT and they moved to their home in Norwich where they began their married life.

In 1965, Harry and Janna moved to Sudbury, MA when Harry became the manager of engineering services for a small company which designed and manufactured precision calibration instruments. His next position was at the Barnstead Company, a division of Sybron Corporation, which designed and manufactured water purification systems. Harry became president of the division.

After a discussion with some members of the MIT faculty, he became convinced that he should consider owning his own company. In 1975, he bought a small company which manufactured dust collecting equipment. Using his engineering and production skills, Harry expanded the company to include design, manufacture, and installation of the dust collection system. At the request of the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection he developed a system for removing particulate and fumes from medical waste incineration and was awarded a process patent for his invention. Harry sold the company after 25 years of hard work and continued to consult for his previous customers for several years.

Harry and Janna moved to Lincoln, MA in 1968 where Janna still resides in that family home. They have two children; Jannette and Henry Harrison V and one grandchild, Henry Harrison VI."

What kind of fingers do the Hadley have; **Type A**, **Type B** or **Type C**? Do these same characteristics exist with the toes as they do with the fingers?


We also ask if there are other physical characteristics that may have a common showing in members of our Hadley family?
